- <u>Title:</u> To conduct the 'Plastic free Campaign' in and around College Campus.
- Goal: -To make the college campus clean.

To contribute to the Swaccha Bharat Abhiyan.

- <u>The context:</u> The motto of our institution is 'Bahujan Sukhay Bahujan Hitay'. We are working sincerely to imbibe a sense of social responsibility among our students. Various social endeavours are undertaken for the same by students and staff. One of the main reasons of environment pollution is the excessive use of Plastic. This year the college has focused on this issue and decided to make the college campus plastic free.
- The Practice:- The NSS volunteers frequently conduct cleaning campaign in the college. This year the college decided to clean the in and around college campus and to make it Plastic free. The plastic garbage was collected by the students and was handed over to the gram panchayat for proper disposal. The students and NSS programme officers persuaded the nearby shopkeepers and professionals to avoid the use of plastic bag. 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#### **BEST PRACTICE 2:**

- <u>Title:</u> Creating awareness among girl students about issues related to female health.
- Goals: To create awareness about female health.

  To provide counselling to girl students on health related issues..
- The Context: Harsul and the surrounding region has been declared as "Tribal Zone" by Govt. Of Maharashtra. Majority of our girl students are socially and economically backward. Majority of them are underweight and physically weak. According to the motto of our institution "Bahujan Hitay Bahujan Sukhay". We are working sincerely for the welfare and betterment of this downtrodden section of society. The Ladies Forum of our college has focused on the issue of female health and accordingly trying to create awareness among the girl students on this issue.
- Practice: The Ladies Forum has been constituted for the purpose of creating awareness among female students about issues related to them. A good number of our girl students are underweight and suffer from malnutrition. This leads to further health problems .The Ladies Forum has focused on this issue and has provided necessary guidance and counselling to girl students on the issue of female health. The Ladies Forum has organized the lectures of eminent medical practitioners for this purpose. Haemoglobin CHECK UP Camp was organised especially for the girl students to detect the deficiency among them. The girl students are informed about the consequences of the same.
- Evidence of Success: We have received very positive feedback from girl students. They are also involved in creating awareness on this issue in the surrounding region.
- Problems encountered and resources required: The girl students feel shy to share the health problems and to take medical advice on this issue. Majority of girl students are from poor financial background and hence receive poor diet. The major reason of health problem is inadequate diet. College needs additional financial and human resources to continue this practice effectively. We need to tie up with the social organisations for this issue.
